

# SENIOR LETTER

## JANUARY 2018

### 1. SUBMIT YOUR COLLEGE APPLICATIONS NOW!!

For the easiest way to apply, go online and submit your application. Your transcript will need to be sent to the college(s) you apply to. After submitting your application, you will need to tell Mrs. Bazen where to send your transcript. Note: Some applications require recommendations from teachers, principal, or counselor. **Allow one week for these recommendations.** \*\*\*If you are not sure which college you want to go to, narrow your options to 3 or 4, and send applications to them. You will lose your application fee, but this allows you more time to make a final decision.

### 2. FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION:

-The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) should be completed by all students intending to go to college. This form is available to submit beginning October 1 and received by March 1. This is FREE and available at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). You can also download a "FAFSA ON THE WEB WORKSHEET" which will help you in filling out the form online. **PLEASE NOTE THE DATE CHANGE FOR SUBMITTING THE FAFSA.** The process begins in October and you will submit "prior-prior" years' taxes. When submitting the FAFSA for the 2018-2019 school year, you will be entering your 2016 tax information. The sooner you submit this form, the earlier you will find out how much financial aid you will receive. Money does run out so apply as soon as possible!!!!

### 3. SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE AT THIS TIME:

**American Legion Scholarships** - There are various scholarships available to seniors. Visit the website [www.michiganlegion.org](http://www.michiganlegion.org) to obtain scholarship information. Deadlines vary depending on the scholarship.

**America's Farmers Grow Ag Leaders** – This new scholarship opportunity, sponsored by the Monsanto Fund, will be awarding over \$500,000 in scholarships. Students must meet certain criteria. Apply online at [ffa.org/scholarships](http://ffa.org/scholarships). Deadline is February 1.

**2017/18 Blood Drive Scholarship** – To be eligible for this scholarship a student must 1) be a senior, 2) have donated, or attempted to donate blood at least once during his/her high school career, 3) write a 200-300 word essay persuading fellow high school students to donate blood. See the counseling office for a form that must be attached to your typed essay. Deadline: April 20.

**Calvin College** offers sixteen Howard Hughes Medical Institute scholarships (\$2,500 per year for student in sciences or mathematics – February 1 deadline). Applicants must be admitted to and attend Calvin College. Students who plan to major in biology, chemistry, physics, or mathematics and plan to pursue a career in research or post-secondary education are eligible for this scholarship. **Davenport University** - The Gerald R. Ford Memorial Scholarship is a full-ride scholarship covering tuition, room, board, textbooks, fees and study abroad. A GPA of 3.75 and a minimum ACT score of 31 or SAT of 1430 are required. Deadline is January 15. Visit the website at [www.davenport.edu](http://www.davenport.edu). Other scholarships are also available.

**GRCC Honors Program** – The GRCC Honors Program is now accepting applications. As a member of the program, students will develop leadership, service, research and creative scholarship skills all while earning an associate degree. The application can be found at: [www.grcc.edu/honors](http://www.grcc.edu/honors)

**Grand Rapids Community College Scholarships** – Applicants are considered for over 300 different opportunities by completing the general application. Access to the scholarship application is at [grcc.academicworks.com](http://grcc.academicworks.com) and log in using your GRCC Blackboard login credentials. Deadline is March 15.

**Grand Rapids Community Foundation Scholarship** - a variety of 60 scholarships are offered via one application. Awards are based on academics, financial need, a statement of aspirations and goals, and outside activities. Applications must be postmarked by April 1. Awards average between \$1000 to \$2,500. Scholarship information is available at [www.grfoundation.org](http://www.grfoundation.org).

**Hugh & Eve Meeter Calvinism Award** – This \$3,500 first prize and three \$2,000 second prize awards are given to students who write a research paper dealing with “John Calvin and Women”. This award is payable to student tuition accounts at the following colleges: Calvin, Dordt, King’s (Canada), Redeemer (Canada), Kuyper and, Trinity Christian. **Lake Michigan Credit Union Lloyd F. Hutt Scholarship** - To be eligible for one of ten \$2,000 scholarships, students must be members or dependent children of Lake Michigan Credit Union members. A short application and a 750 to 1500 word essay are required. Applications are available in the counseling office or at [www.lmcu.org/hutt](http://www.lmcu.org/hutt). Deadline: January 31.

**Michigan Society of Professional Engineers** - The Michigan Society of Professional Engineers offers numerous scholarships to high school seniors interested in pursuing an engineering degree at an Accreditation Board of Engineering Technology accredited Michigan college or university. A 3.0 minimum GPA for 10th and 11th grade and a SAT score are required. Deadline: February 7. Applications are available on the MSPE website [www.michiganspe.org](http://www.michiganspe.org).

**Prospective Teachers:** For students who are baptized or professing members of First Netherlands Reformed Congregation (Beckwith) specific funds are allocated to assist students who are going into the field of education. See Mrs. Bazen for details.

**Raise.me** – Getting scholarships from colleges for your achievements in high school.

1. Add your achievements - Add your course grades, clubs, sports, volunteer activities, and more to your portfolio.
2. Earn Scholarships - For each achievement, you'll get scholarships from different colleges, which you can redeem when you attend that college.
3. Discover Colleges - Learn about and follow different colleges from across the country to find schools that are the best fit for you.

**Roger B. Chaffee Scholarship Fund** - recipient is awarded \$3,000 toward his or her higher education. This scholarship is a continuing memorial to the Kent County astronaut who lost his life in the tragic Apollo I - NASA shuttle fire January 27, 1967. This award is given to an outstanding student who wishes to pursue an education in the sciences or engineering related to space technology with a minimum GPA of 3.5. **SAE Engineering Scholarships** - for those students who intend to earn a degree in engineering or related science, meet minimum requirements with regard to GPA, SAT and/or ACT as outlined in the individual requirements of each scholarship. For full details and an application go online to [www.sae.org](http://www.sae.org). Deadline: March 15.

**University Club of Grand Rapids Scholarships** - Three scholarships will be awarded to students who express a strong desire to remain in West Michigan upon completion of their studies. Applicants may attend any school: in-state, out-of-state, two year or four year education. Each \$1,000.00 scholarship is renewable for three more years. Application deadline is February 1. Applications are available at [UniversityClubGR.com](http://UniversityClubGR.com).

**University of Michigan Club of Grand Rapids Scholarships** - Sixty scholarships will be awarded to students who will be enrolling at the University of Michigan. Each \$3,750.00 scholarship is renewable for four years. Scholarships are awarded for high academic achievement, outstanding citizenship as reflected by participation in extracurricular activities, and financial need. Deadline: February 9. 4. VISIT COLLEGES - Examine the place you are going! If you decide to visit a college, you must fill out an excused absence form (available in the office) two days prior to your visit.
5. **GRCC Job Training Programs** – GRCC offers eight Job Training programs. These are non-credit programs that run 18-22 weeks and students attend classes for 34 hours per week.
