Dual Enrollment

The Michigan Legislature passed Public Acts 131-134 which allow nonpublic students to go to a college and dual enroll up to a maximum of 10 courses in four years. Colleges must bill the Michigan Department of Education directly for students in private schools. MDE calculates the correct payment amount (likely a maximum of \$600 per course). To receive both college and high school credit, the college course must be at or above the level of non-core courses offered at PCH and preapproved by the PCH Counselor. Courses that are considered a hobby, craft, recreational, physical education, or religious education are ineligible. CLEP/AP Tests

REMINDER: Students also may take courses at PCH and then take the CLEP test to exempt college requirements and/or get college credit depending on college requirements. Students considering this option may want to purchase a book of sample tests and review notes to prepare. A number of PCH students have passed CLEP tests for: Government, Biology, Chemistry, Economics, US History I, and Psychology. AP English (plus a passing test score) also earns college credit.
